Subj: OFFICER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT 101/201 ANNOUNCEMENT

Ref: (a) NSCC Regulations, Chapter 7, Section 0733
(b) NSCC Advancement & Training Manual, Chapter 2, Paragraph (F)(2)

1. SUMMARY. An OPD 101/201 session will be held at the Barnes Building, 495 Summer Street, Boston, on Saturday March 16, 2013, from 0800 – 1600.
2. UNIFORM OF THE DAY. For officers who meet the height-weight standards of Reference (a), the Navy Working Uniform (NWU) or Service Khaki w/Ribbons is prescribed. For all others, the NSCC alternate uniform or business casual attire is prescribed.
3. ELIGIBILITY. Please note the following when deciding which course to register for:
 - a. Adult volunteers who have not taken OPD 101 should register for that course. All other volunteers are eligible and encouraged to take OPD 201. Despite the above, however, CO's may at their discretion, register a new volunteer for OPD 201 if he/she will be assuming duties such as Administrative or Training Officer.
 - b. The OPD 201 course will include new information regarding major changes to the NSCC Internet page, including an fully online enrollment management system. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that all CO's, XO's, Admin and Training Officers who have not taken OPD 201 recently make every effort to attend.
4. LOGISTICS. Free parking is available on-site. As of this date, it is our intention to provide free lunch for all attendees; however, plans can change, so all attendees will be notified prior to 16 MAR if they will need to brown-bag or bring cash.
