- A **typed** [NSCTNG001 Request for Training Authority](#)
- This waiver packet
- \$300 cashier's check or money order made out to "USNSCC"
- Copy of Health Insurance card
- A clear photocopy of the driver's license (or equivalent) of ANY ADULT wishing to access Fort Devens for drop-off or graduation
- [NSCADM001 \(Page 7/8\) Medical History Supplemental](#)
(if cadet is bringing **any** medications)

Warning: Billets cannot be "reserved" – all billets are first-come, first-served, and will be finalized as "approved" only upon LCDR Noguera's **receipt** of a Magellan request from the Unit CO **and** a complete packet in hard copy.

Commanding Officers:

- In Magellan, request a billet for RT-MA-1901
- Once the billet is "Confirmed" by the COTC, forward all paperwork (**including Invoice**) to address below in hard copy
- Do not mail partial packets
- Combine multiple packets whenever possible
- Do not send correspondence via any method requiring a signature upon delivery

4. Hazardous and Strenuous Training

Releasor and Cadet Participant understand and acknowledge that the aforementioned training may include (but is not limited to) such hazardous, strenuous, or stressful activities or situations as:

- intense discipline;
- regular physical training;
- significant periods of time conducting military drill;
- frequent exposure to the sun, and long periods of outdoor activity;
- group living, open showers, and generally limited privacy;
- night watch-standing;
- swimming;
- participation in obstacle course events, including climbing without safety harnesses;
- physical competitions such as tug-of war;
- training in defensive tactics;
- training that requires lifting heavy objects

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5. Standard Operating Procedures & Information Packet

Releasor and Cadet Participant have read, understand, agree, and assent to all of the policies and procedures set forth in the Parent Information Guide, Recruit Information Guide, and the Standard Operating Procedures for Recruit Training Command New England (published at www.newenglandseacadets.org/training/rtc), including but not limited to:

- male recruit haircut guidelines
- required passing score on physical fitness test at check-in 01JUL19
- special paperwork requirements for any medications to be brought to RTC-NE
- the seabag list

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6. Liability for Damage caused by Participants

Releasor understands and acknowledges that he (she) will be liable for any damage or loss to the United States Government or the US Naval Sea Cadet Corps that is caused by his (her) child/ward's negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct. Releasor understands and agrees that he (she) will be liable for any damage or loss to any third party that is caused by his (her) child/ward's negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct.

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7. Insurance; Emergency Health Care

Releasor understands and acknowledges that the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps has only supplemental/ excess health insurance through AIG, and that Releasor's personal health insurance will be used first to pay for any necessary medical treatment. This supplemental/ excess health insurance does not cover pre-existing conditions. Amounts not covered by Releasor's insurance (or if Releasor does not carry health insurance) may be covered by the NSCC's AIG policy.

Releasor consents to the treatment of his (her) child/ward by the medical personnel of Recruit Training Command New England, and by civilian providers/medical facilities as may be required in the event of any illness or accident arising during the aforementioned training.

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8. Medical Conditions; Risk; Accommodations; Medications

Releasor acknowledges that the NSCC training staff have limited medical resources. Releasor assumes full responsibility and risk for cadets who attend Recruit Training Command New England with chronic or pre-existing medical conditions and/or who require prescription medication. Releasor acknowledges his (her) responsibility to completely and fully divulge any and all medical and psychological conditions of Cadet Participants, and any prescription requirements and the side effects and contraindications thereof, to the NSCC training staff prior to the training.

Releasees will make reasonable modifications in any policies, practices, and procedures that deny equal access to individuals with disabilities, unless such a modification would result in a fundamental alteration of the nature of the training or cause significant difficulty or expense when considered in light of Recruit Training Command New England's size, resources, structure, and nature. If accommodations are granted prior to the training, but become unreasonably burdensome during the training, Releasor assumes all responsibility and expense for transporting the Cadet Participant home.

Unless expressly informed otherwise by Releasor, Releasees will be free to administer the following medications and treatments to Cadet Participants based on common-sense assessments and without consultation with Releasor: ibuprofen (e.g., Advil), acetaminophen (e.g., Tylenol), acetylsalicylic acid (e.g., Aspirin), calcium carbonate (e.g., Tums), magnesium hydroxide (e.g., Milk of Magnesia), bismuth subsalicylate (e.g., Pepto-Bismol), diphenhydramine (e.g., Benadryl), benzocaine (e.g., Anbesol), menthol (e.g., Hall's cough drops), hydrocortisone (e.g., Cortaid), calamine and/or pramoxine (e.g., Caladryl), bacitracin, neomycin, and/or polymyxin B (e.g., Neosporin). Any exceptions shall be noted by Releasor on the NSCADM001 (Page 03/04) Medical History form in the Cadet Participant's service jacket.

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9. Transportation

Releasor assumes full responsibility for the travel of his (her) child/ward's travel to and from Fort Devens, and understands that the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps can and will not provide such transportation or transportation costs. Releasor will be responsible for making all arrangements for and paying all costs associated with transportation to Fort Devens on 01 July 2019 and to his (her) child/ward's final destination on 13 July 2019. These costs include but are not limited to airline fares, bus fares, taxi/hackney carriage fares, hotel fees, meals, and gratuities.

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10. Dismissal

Releasor and Cadet Participant understand and acknowledge that LCDR Christopher Donahue, NSCC retains sole and absolute discretion to dismiss a cadet from the training.

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11. Early Dismissal

Releasor understands and agrees that if a Cadet Participant needs to be dismissed from the training for any reason, including but not limited to medical problems or injuries, disciplinary problems, family emergencies, or the mid-course cancellation of the training by either the U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps or the United States Government, the Releasor assumes all responsibility and expense for the homeward trip of his (her) child/ward. Cadet Participants who are dismissed early may be placed under supervision and/or confined to their berthing space, where deemed necessary by the Releasees, until a parent/guardian can retrieve the cadet, or other transportation arrangements can be made. If Releasor cannot arrange for transportation within 24 hours of the determination that a cadet is to be dismissed, Releasor consents to RTC-NE releasing their child/ward to the custody of their home state's Department of Children and Families or equivalent state agency.

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12. Searches of Person and Property

Releasor and Cadet Participant understand and agree that Releasees may, under any circumstance where misconduct is suspected, the well-being of a cadet or third party is endangered, or the efficacy of the training is threatened, search the person and/or property of any cadet. Male personnel will search male cadets and cadet spaces; female personnel will search female cadets and cadet spaces.

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13. Use of Photographs and Motion Pictures

Releasor agrees and understands that photographs and motion picture recordings will be taken of his (her) child/ward and consents to the publication of the same in connection with educational or recruiting programs of the United States Naval Sea Cadet Corps, its component Units, the Department of Defense, the United States Coast Guard, or the Navy League of the United States, and hereby assigns to said organizations all right, title, and interest in the above described photographs or motion picture recordings for any further use.

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14. Force of Waiver and Agreement

Releasor expressly agrees that this release and waiver agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the United States, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and/or the jurisdiction in which the agreement is executed, and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

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15. Breadth of Agreement

This release contains the entire agreement of the parties hereto and the terms of this release are contractual and not a mere recital.

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16. Acknowledgements

Releasor acknowledges that being of lawful age and of sound mind, he (she) has read this release and knows the contents thereof and signs this release as his (her) own free act.


